Jeff Nygren '12 Hikes the Appalachian Trail

Travels more than 2,000 miles on foot over seven months

After graduating from The Ohio State University, **Jeff Nygren '12** embarked on a seven-month journey to cover more than 2,000 miles on foot. "I heard about the Appalachian Trail for the first time in high school and really wanted to attempt a thru-hike or end-to-end hike," said Nygren. "At the time, attending college took precedence, so after graduation I set out to accomplish my goal."

Although Nygren began hiking the trail alone and not in an organized group, he was seldom actually alone. "There are always a lot of hikers beginning from the start and I met many people over time," commented Nygren. "I hiked with a lady named Heather for the majority of the trail, from Tennessee to Maine. I formed many great friendships along the way."

It took Nygren seven months to complete the trail. "I took plenty of time to stop and smell the roses," replied Nygren. "Emotionally, the most challenging part was the last few hundred miles. I was having the time of my life to be sure, however, I was more than ready to finish and

put this accomplishment in the books! Physically, the most challenging part was from the Vermont/New Hampshire border to the summit of Mt. Katahdin in Maine (the northern terminus). The trail travels 100 miles through the thick of the infamous White Mountains and goes right over the summit of Mt. Washington, which is, quite factually, home to the worst weather in America."

Nygren finished the trail on October 10, 2013. His favorite memories revolve around the countless nights spent in the middle of the woods. "We sat around a small fire and enjoyed









each other's company and the solitude of the wilderness," remembered Nygren. "I also remember being meters away from finishing a seven month, 2,000+ mile, fourteen state and three season journey. I spent two and a half hours getting drunk with twenty other thru-hikers who finished their trip the same day. Of course, I hadn't considered the five mile, strenuous, downhill hike back to the bottom but it was one hell of a party. Those memories will stay close to my heart for the rest of my life."

Currently, Nygren lives in Upper Arlington, Ohio and is on staff at a Grandview area child care center.

Jim Nein '67


Private practice attorney for more than 40 years
